A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

Living Out the Greatest Commandment

In our reading Mark 12:28-34, we read of an encounter where Jesus is asked by a teacher of the law, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" Without hesitation, Jesus answers, drawing from two key passages of Scripture that define our faith and purpose: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength," and "Love your neighbour as yourself." This passage is where BPUC mission statement comes from: To Love God and Love Our Neighbour. Let's start with that first commandment: Love God with everything you are. Jesus calls us to love God with our heart, soul, mind, and strength. That means not just having a surface-level love for God but committing wholeheartedly, surrendering our lives to Him. It's about being open with God, bringing Him all we are—our hopes, our fears, our strengths, and our struggles. Loving God is an invitation to bring Him into every aspect of our lives, inviting Him into our hearts, so that His love can transform us from the inside

When we dedicate our lives to loving God fully, we aren't simply following a commandment; we're building a relationship with the One who created us, who knows us better than we know ourselves, and who loves us unconditionally. Loving God is our foundation, and it starts with spending time in His presence, seeking His wisdom, and aligning our lives with His will. As we do, our hearts are softened, our perspectives broadened, and our spirits strengthened, preparing us for the second part of this great commandment: to love our neighbour as ourselves.

And who is our neighbour? Jesus' answer is simple: it's everyone. It's the person sitting next to us on a Sunday morning, the family next door, the person we cross paths with at the grocery store, the homeless, and even those who may be difficult to love. To love our neighbour is to see them through God's eyes, recognising their infinite worth as beloved children of God. It's a call to empathy, kindness, and active compassion, reminding us that faith isn't just about loving God in isolation—it's about expressing that love to



those around us.

Living out this call to "love your neighbour" isn't always easy, especially in a world that often values individualism over community and judgment over grace. Yet, Jesus challenges us to go beyond what is easy or comfortable. He doesn't ask us to love others when it's convenient or when they're easy to love; He calls us to love without limits, with a radical love that reflects the love we've received from God. This might look like helping someone in need, listening without judgment, or forgiving when it feels impossible. It could mean speaking up for justice, standing alongside the hurting, or simply being present for someone who feels alone.

And remember, we're not asked to do this in our own strength. God's Spirit empowers us to love beyond our natural capacity, helping us to live out these commandments in real, tangible ways. He fills us with His love, allowing it to overflow into our relationships, our community, and beyond.

Our mission statement—**Love God and Love Our Neighbour**—is more than just words. It's our guiding light, reminding us of the life Jesus calls us to. It's a reminder that loving God fully and loving our neighbour wholeheartedly are inseparable. When we open ourselves to God's love, that love transforms us and pours out into the world, impacting lives, healing brokenness, and bringing hope to those around us.

So, as we go about our week, let's reflect on this commandment anew. Let's ask ourselves, "How can I deepen my love for God today? How can I show His love to the people I encounter?" Whether through small acts of kindness, a listening ear, or a helping hand, each of us has an opportunity to live out this mission. And as we do, we bring the love of Christ into every corner of our lives, fulfilling Jesus' call to love in both word and deed.

May we be a church known for our love—a love that's rooted in God and shared with the world.
