A message from Rev. Agron Moad

Embracing God's Purpose for Our Lives

In our faith journey, we often face moments of doubt, questioning whether our lives have a greater purpose. We may feel unworthy or ill-equipped, but God's call is a divine invitation to trust Him, step into His plan, and be transformed.

In Luke 5:1-11 and Isaiah 6:1-8, we see two powerful examples of people called by God in unexpected ways, forever changing their lives and history.

The Calling of Simon Peter: A Transformation of Faith

In Luke 5:1-11, Simon Peter, a weary fisherman, experiences a miraculous moment. After a night of failed fishing, Jesus tells him, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." Though doubtful, Peter obeys. The result? A catch so abundant it nearly breaks the nets. Overwhelmed, Peter acknowledges his unworthiness, but Jesus calls him to something greater: "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people."

Peter's story teaches us that God's call isn't based on our abilities but on His grace. Even in our doubts and limitations, obedience leads to transformation and blessings beyond what we can imagine.

The Vision of Isaiah: Purification and Obedience

Isaiah 6:1-8 presents a different yet equally profound calling. Isaiah has a vision of God's holiness, surrounded by angels declaring, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty." Overcome by his sinfulness, Isaiah cries, "Woe to me! I am ruined!" But God, in His grace, purifies him with a burning coal, removing his guilt. When God asks, "Whom shall I send?" Isaiah responds, "Here am I. Send me!"



Like Peter, Isaiah recognises his inadequacy. But God does not leave him there—He cleanses, transforms, and calls him to a greater mission. This is the essence of God's calling: it's not about our perfection, but our willingness to be transformed and obey.

A Call to Follow: From Doubt to Purpose

The stories of Peter and Isaiah reveal a truth: God calls ordinary people to extraordinary purposes. Whether in a fishing boat or a temple vision, He meets us where we are and invites us into His divine plan.

Like Isaiah and Peter, we may struggle with doubts and insecurities. But God's call is not based on our ability or worthiness—it is an invitation to rely on His grace. When we respond with humility and obedience, we step into a life of purpose and transformation.

Conclusion: Trusting God's Call

God's call is not about perfection, but obedience. He invites each of us to a life of transformation and service. In our families, workplaces, and communities, He calls us to follow, trust, and embrace His purpose.

Are we ready to say, "Here am I. Send me"? Just as Peter left his nets behind and Isaiah accepted his mission, we, too, are called to something greater. It may be uncertain or challenging, but it is always a journey of transformation.

Trust God's call. Step into His purpose. And just as He transformed Peter and Isaiah, He will transform us when we obey.
